Session 1: June 9 – June 20

ELEMENTARY:

Workshop	Instructor	Description
Puppets and Story Theatre	Cindy Uribe	In this class students will create a play as well as the puppet characters for the play. The puppets will be constructed using fabrics, felt and found materials. The students will perform the play at the end of the session.
Art International (ages 8-12 only)	Carmen Ruiz	Students will travel through time and continents to experience the arts and cultures of different countries of the world. Fun awaits them as they dive into art adventures exploring what makes us all unique and similar at the same time. Countries they will visit include: Japan, Ireland, Mexico and Central America. Afternoon Adventures (Elementary and Primary): June 9 – August 1

Afternoon Adventures is offered in all sessions from 11:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. Monday-Friday. Children from 3 years to 12 years are welcome. Registration is required for each session, but you can leave your child for however long you need.

The Afternoon Adventures schedule will be:

- 11:30 – 1:00 pm: Walk to Virginia Street Park and have lunch (provided by Silver City Schools).
- 1:00 pm – 2:30 pm: Nap time for those children who nap.
- 1:00 pm – 4:30 pm: Arts and crafts, games, music, play, and outdoor activities.

Afternoon Adventures (Toddlers): June 9 – July 18

Afternoon Adventures for Toddlers is offered in the first three sessions only from 11:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. Monday-Friday. Children from 14 months – 3 yrs are welcome. Registration is required for each session, but you can leave your child for however long you need.

The Afternoon Adventures schedule for Toddlers will be:

- 12:00 – 12:30 pm: Eat lunch together in the toddler room. Each child should bring a cold sack lunch with them each day.
- 12:30 pm – 2:30 pm: Nap time in the toddler room.
- 3:00 pm – 4:30 pm: The toddlers will join the other Afternoon Adventures students for games, play, music, and outdoor activities.
